Student Assessment Data – Elementary or middle school assessment results on the Michigan Student Test of Educational Progress (M-STEP), high school assessment results on the M-STEP component of the Michigan Merit Exam (MME), and assessment results for students with disabilities on Michigan's Alternative Assessment Program (MI-Access).

- Presents achievement data for all four tested subjects (English language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies) compared to targets for all students as well as subgroups of students
- Helps parents understand achievement progress within schools and compare these to district and state achievement

Specialized Schools

In addition to special program and services provided by the Adams Township School District for children from birth through 25 years, special education is also provided for children who are more severely impaired at the CCISD Learning Center program in Hancock and for students who have required an alternative avenue in the general education setting can enroll in the OdysseyWare Seat Time Waiver program. The purpose of these programs are to provide classroom programs, specialized equipment and supportive services for children in a larger geographic area to better meet their needs.

Students requiring the services of a speech and language therapist, occupational therapist, physical therapist, school social worker, hearing therapist, or teacher consultant receive these services in their own school buildings. The therapists, social workers, and teacher-consultants are employed by the CCISD and travel to the respective school sites to perform services for the 2015-2016 school year.

Placement of a student in these programs or services, follow state special education guidelines for initiating and implementing an IEP. Candidates who prefer to attend the alternative school (Seat Time Waiver) need the complete the necessary school of choice documents before a student is released.

The measure of the success of the special education program is monitored through the CIMS committee and the Michigan Department of Education. Each IEP includes participation of the special education teacher, general education staff and parent.

Vocational technical education is offered through the CCISD in which seven other districts also are members. For the 2015 – 2016 academic year, the following CTE classes were offered in Nurse's Aide, Automotive Technology and Health Careers. Work study opportunities are offered through the Adams Township School Disrict that include various local businesses. Total membership in these classes included

Curriculum (GLCE and MMC)

The curriculum is monitored by building administration and department heads to assure that content being taught is updated and followed. Teachers have on file in principal's office a detailed document of Michigan Merit Curriculum and how it is being implemented in the classroom. District goals have been formulated to address the entire curriculum and the transition from K – 12 within the district.

The Adams Township School District, under the direction of the counselor, has on file in the Principal's and Guidance office a copy of the career pathway guide. The guide is used to schedule and place students in grade 7 -12 after completing the online Career Cruising results in the seventh grade. The six career pathways include: Arts and Communication, Business/Management/Marketing and Technology, Engineering/Manufacturing/Industrial Technology, Health Sciences, Human Services, Natural Resources/Agriscience. At the elementary school, students are placed into grade/classroom upon recommendations from principal, teachers and parents giving consideration to a class make up that includes, at risk population, gender, class size, etc.

Parent/Teacher Conference Participation

Our district average participation in the Fall of 2015 averages 84% (South Range Elementary: 93%, Jeffers High School – 75%). The Spring conferences of 2015 are scheduled with parents at South Range Elementary so a true percentage cannot be determined. This past spring, severe weather cancelled the parent/teacher conference at the high school, so a percentage was not calculated.

Postsecondary Options – Dual Enrollment

The Postsecondary Options Act provides that students who meet certain criteria enroll in college courses at nearby colleges or universities. Students may elect to receive college credit, high school credit or, in some cases, both high school and college credit for these courses. The local school district is required to pay for a prorated portion of tuition costs (1/14th of the foundation allowance) per semester of college enrolled.
