Public Participation

- There were no public comments.

Superintendent's Report-Tim Keteri

- The bond project is getting near the ballot in August. SRES will get new windows, a new parking traffic pattern, and technology and security upgrades. JHS will get a new roof (WHERE), an addition to the trades, expanding the gym, upgrading the alumni room, and convert the old shop room into classrooms.
- Lucas Guili resigned as he will be moving back to Texas. He will be missed, as he
 did an excellent job with the students in his resource classroom. That position will
 be posted as well as some others. SRE will need a 3rd-grade teacher and a Young
 Fives teacher. JHS is also establishing a business path and will hire for that.
- The Post Office offered to buy their half of the building for \$60,000. The offer was declined.
- The administrative contracts can be rolled over for another 3 years.
- Negotiations with the union will begin.
- He thanked Val Dobson for doing the highlights for the Board in the past years in her role as a parapro. Her role will be changing next year.

Principal's Report-Kim Harris, South Range Elementary
