Superintendent's Report-Tim Keteri

- He will be meeting with Lamers to discuss transportation, including routes. It is expected that they will have a large increase next year.
- Hannah Holmes has been taking on some responsibilities in the office, including Meal Magic and Will Sub.
- The state budget looks promising. There looks to be more money in per pupil money that does not have strings attached to programs.

Principal's Report-Kim Harris, South Range Elementary

She shared MTSS school-wide data. Reading scores are really good.
 Kindergarten started the year with 54% of students at benchmark and now are at 78%. They will be sending out a parent survey about student support.

Principal's Report-John Sanregret, Jeffers High School

- He has been focusing on overarching school improvement in rigor, relevance, and relationships. The staff has made improvements in some areas. He feels good after a year and a half of this being a focus. In March, JHS will be doing a thematic unit that will focus on relevance. They will have community presenters and field trips planned.
- CTE classes add experiences to JHS students. Trades classes are helping students learn the global importance of it.
- They are focusing on attendance and timeliness as it has direct ties to the workforce that students will be entering.

Business and Athletic Report-Steve Nordstrom

- January was busy, especially without Diane Keranen. One thing of focus was a food service review.
- He is looking into a grant for connectivity.
- There was an increase in Title money.

- Winter sports seasons are winding down. Hockey and swimming have had great seasons.
- Copper Island Academy would like to co-op with hockey, baseball, and softball.
 This would allow JHS to have JV teams for baseball and softball. If JHS does not co-op, they would do so with another school.
- He thanked JHS teachers Rachel Sondegrath and Paige Lewandowski for helping him make the new athletic record posters.
